<u>ADVENT CHILDRENS WORKSHOP</u>: Sunday 1st December (First Sunday of Advent) in St Joseph's Parish Centre 2-4pm. It is a fun, family afternoon as we start our preparations for Christmas, open to children from Nursery to Year 4. Places must be booked as numbers are limited to a maximum of 50. Refreshments will be provided. Children must be accompanied by an adult who can also assist them with their crafts. <u>ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL</u>: The bill presented in the House of Commons by Kim Leadbeater MP gets its second reading on Friday 29th November. Please consider contacting your local MP - the charity *Right to Life UK* has a simple online mechanism to do so. THREE AFRICAN PEAKS CHALLENGE – UPDATE! This year David Farmer, Deputy Head Teacher at our primary school, is undertaking the African Three Peaks challenge by 'virtually climbing' the highest three African Peaks (Kilimanjaro, Stanley and Kenya) to raise a target of \pounds 4000 required to drill a bore hole at Thembinfundo, a special needs school in South Africa. Thanks to the kind donations the total raised is now \pounds 495, and with Gift Aid that makes \pounds 618, which has enabled the purchase of the water tanks for storage. TRAVELLING CRIB: Could you offer Mary and Joseph a room for the night? It is a lovely, unique way to help families prepare for Christmas and to just stop and pause for a short while in the busy build up to Christmas. We use a soft play crib that is suitable for children. Families who volunteer get given a date for the crib to come to their home and the details of the families who will have it before and after them, so they can get in touch with each other to arrange drop off / pick up. The crib will get blessed in church on the **1st Sunday of Advent (1st**

December) and a family takes it home. They have it in their home for that day. They open it up and set it up, light a candle, read the story and say a prayer. They then pack it up and pass it on to the next family the next day. The crib then travels around the parish throughout Advent. We also include some optional activities to do together as a family to enhance the experience.
